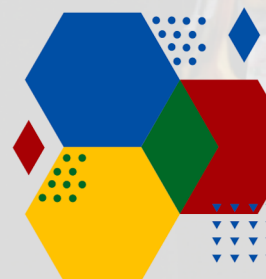

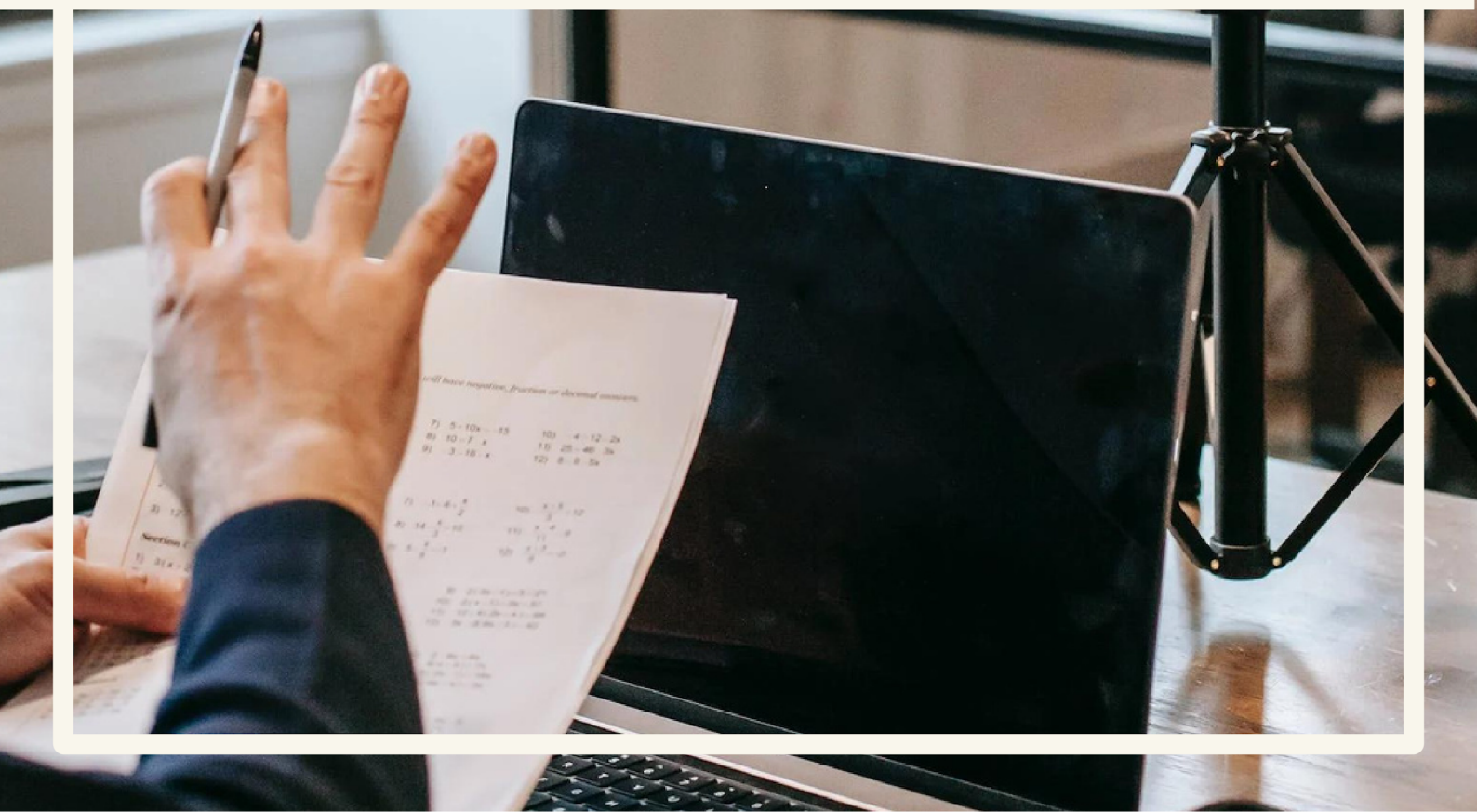

TEACHING AND LEARNING: "FLEXIBLE AND STUDENT-CENTERED"

UNITA "Teaching and Learning: flexible and student-centered" group is preparing personalized study paths through internationalization.

This second year has been focused on the preparation of **models of internationalized curricula**, the exchange of **best practices** of pedagogical approaches in our European context, and the implementation of a survey aiming to assess the learning experience in UNITA from the **students' point of view**.

Our strengthened community of **staff** involved in the **academic formation** purposes works jointly towards a UNITA identity of education.

BUILDING THE UNITA EDUCATIONAL FRAMEWORK

A first stage has consisted in gathering the set of study offers related to the three strategic themes at both bachelor and master degree level:

- **circular economy**
- **renewable energies**
- **cultural heritage**

This offer has been also **implemented digitally** to facilitate the identification of relevant internationalized study paths. Digital cartography has been also used aiming to make the options of internationalization of learning paths within UNITA as well as to identify the academic research laboratories or groups in which a student could spend a period of internship.

THE IPC PLAN

The assessment of the acquisition of such skills has been experimented on a cohort of students during their long term mobility.

The activity, called **International Personal Career Plan**, constitutes an international version of the classical personal and professional plan that a learner produces to better identify relevant academic study path.

SURVEYS DEVELOPED

In consistency with the **student-centered approach** of the UNITA's activities (but from a general aspect of the quality assessment approach), a fine tuned survey has been realized in order to assess the students' learning experience within UNITA.

The deployment of this survey should be done for all UNITA activities, in particular the ones related to new forms of mobility, that constitute a set of options for a student to get an international experience of study in the alliance.



MULTILINGUALISM



MULTILINGUALISM

2ND YEAR'S OBJECTIVES

UNITA has been active in promoting multilingualism and enhancing linguistic diversity with the implementation of courses and activities based on intercomprehension (IC) between Romance languages in an English friendly environment.

During the second year of the project the initial issue with the lack of IC experts has been solved with the **1st year trainings** and **IC courses** have been implemented at almost all the universities of the Consortium and have consolidated with a steady increase in participants.

IC SYLLABUS AND UCIL

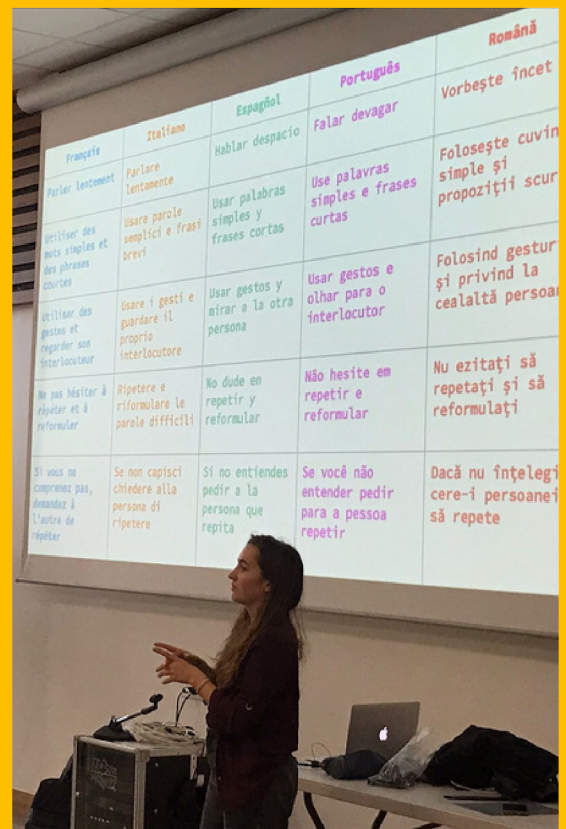
The focus of the 2nd year has been the creation of an IC syllabus for university teachers. The **15-hour pilot course** took place in January and after that a second, improved, edition was proposed in May.

As it has met the interest and enthusiasm of academic staff, it will become a regular course, which will be offered twice a year (early spring – autumn) to all UNITA teachers in the form of **blended UCIL**, in order to create a plurilingual classroom environment where participants can experiment the actual IC gist.

UCILs have been one of the most innovative aspects of 2nd year IC teaching and learning: in order to allow students interact with each other and prove their skill in both receptive and interproductive IC, teachers have organized their schedules so that their students can meet once a week in online Ateliers.

IC OFFER

- **Curricular courses** have been given for language students (UNITO, UPPA, UVT and USMB)
- **IC courses for Erasmus** have remained active for a second year
- UVT has opened its **IC cafés** to all partners and has offered courses to non-philological students.
- USMB has introduced IC in **LSP contexts**
- UNITO has created a fully **online course freely available**.

RESEARCH AT UNITA

HUBS AND CARTOGRAPHY

UNITA has connected researchers from the consortium through knowledge exchange activities between researchers from the alliance in the fields of Renewable Energies, Circular Economy and Cultural Heritage. The number of research and innovation projects devoted to the three core thematic (Cultural Heritage, Circular Economy, Renewable Energy) recorded in the cartography has grown to more than 650 (with contributions of Unita Associated Partners, IPG, UPNA, UNIBS and UNITBV). Regularly, actions promote the emergence of collaborative projects: calls for joint supervision of doctoral theses, Workshops, design and implementation of research hubs, weekly seminars to present projects and areas of research.



RENOWAGRO INTERNATIONAL MEETING

Renowagro International Meeting brought together in Zaragoza more than 600 professionals, company representatives, policymakers, researchers and students to talk about the challenges of the agri-food sector in the use of organic resources and their contributions to the circular economy and sustainable rural development.

The UNITA **Research and Innovation cartography** is a public access database that maps the R&I activities at UNITA universities. The cartography is now open to project submissions on a permanent basis.

DOCTORAL SCHOOL

Our six rectors agreed in June 2022 in Timisoara in the creation of a network of doctoral schools. This network is designing common doctoral itineraries for UNITA PhD students. The 2023 MSCA Cofund (doctoral) call applications was done with the Project Cultural Heritage Outreach in RomAnce Languages : CHORAL.



COTUTELLE CALLS

After the first call for PhD Cotutelles within the alliance in 2021 (with 8 grants offered by UPPA and USMB) and conversion of grants obtained by UNITO researchers into cotutelles projects, 2022 gave the opportunity to UBI, UVT and UNIZAR to launch their calls for cotutelles.

This strong support from the Universities of the alliance to research activities now represents more than **30 PhD students** daily working in UNITA core thematic.

MICRO CREDENTIALS

Research driven learning was also implemented (micro credentials). The three hubs have proposed training programs devoted to Bachelor students in the form of this new training tool.

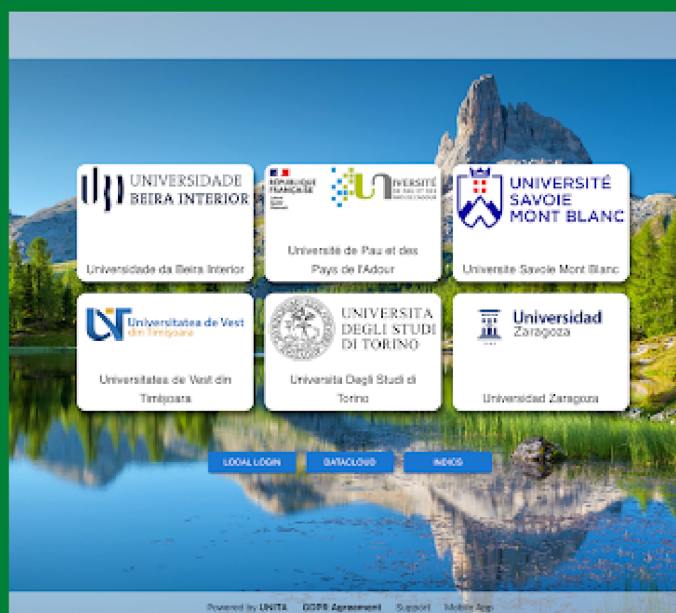

THE #UVC CONCEPT

The UNITA Virtual Campus, **#UVC**, will be a large scale educational, research and management information system, designed to accommodate federated services for a diverse and dynamic academic community.

Based exclusively on **open-source technologies**, #UVC persuades the development of new features to overcome potential limitations, share solutions and invite new collaborators in solving existing or potential issues with the product. Its functional prototype will focus on emphasis on its security, flexibility and scalability aspects both on the applications side and the number of users.



THE OBJECTIVES

The UNITA alliance's objective was to **build a virtual campus** as part of its sustainable development, using internal staff and self hosted solutions. The campus user base is split up into two main categories:

- **Internal** (students, professor, researchers, and administrative staff)
- **External** (interested parties, contractors, life long learners, etc.).

A major component for digitalization is represented by a **mobile application** which enables mobile access to the UNITA Virtual Campus.

THE GUIDES

In order to encourage the mobility of students, teachers and non-teachers, increase the social dimension of the campus and support the community, services were identified and Welcome Guides were created.

The Guides are designed in three formats:

1. A **web page**, as a place to access in cyberspace;
2. **Document**, organized as a print-friendly flyer, but primarily as an electronically shareable document, with structured text and images; and
3. A **Welcome video**, aimed at a more agile and fast dissemination of information.

ADVANCES ON CARTOGRAPHY

Another important milestone for WP5 was the Cartography of a few selected UNITA courses, which is a software **developed in-house** and **available for general use**. The Cartography is in its pre-production phase and will be the subject of further developments to ensure the viability of its widespread use, as well as the ease of updating data relevant to each of the universities; at this time the features are presented only in English but the other UNITA languages will be included in the near future.

The common cartography of UNITA centralized data regarding the three privileged areas: **Circular Economy, Renewable Energy and Cultural Heritage**. The main goal of the cartography is to provide means for exploring the different degrees available in the three domains in the partner universities.

EUROPEAN STUDENT CARD AND SERVICES

The objective of task 5.3 of UNITA is to deploy the European student card in all the universities of the alliance, and to progressively implement services.

Up to this moment, an overview of the services offered to students in UNITA partner universities has been made available.



MEETING IN TIMIȘOARA

Last but not least, the members of WP5 had the pleasure to meet physically at the first WP5 Staff Week in May 2022, in Timișoara, Romania.

The meeting was a productive one and most of its outcomes can be seen also in the development of the aforementioned deliverables and tasks.

MOBILITY 4 ALL

PURPOSE

The UNITA "Mobility4All" aims to support and promote the development of new and innovative forms of mobility for students, while increasing the traditional ones:

- virtual mobility
- mobility based on Erasmus + blended intensive programs
- rural mobility
- student events

For academic staff members, the support is focused on the creation of collaborative international learning.

NEW FORMS OF MOBILITY: STEPS FORWARD

Since November 2020, the six UNITA universities have implemented pedagogical activities at the international scale. In most cases, these activities result of a strong cooperation among the academic staff members of the alliance, supported by the administrative staff members. The activities promote new forms of mobility, such as the **short mobilities** and **internationalization at home**.

The **UNITA rural mobility** is based on a physical mobility corresponding to an immersive experience into a rural zone abroad, linking the activity to the needs of a local rural organism.

UNITA also promotes a hybrid mode of mobility: the Erasmus + Blended Intensive Programs (E+ BIP) used by UNITA to support its thematic schools. It constitutes an opportunity for undergraduate and graduate students, who are generally not used to participate to such thematic schools, as the integration of the later into the study program is not common. More than ten BIP have been scheduled during the second year of the alliance.



MOBILITY 4 ALL

POSITIVE EFFECTS OF UNITA'S INNOVATIVE MOBILITY

Some E+ BIP are also used for internationalizing a part of a course from a regular study program. Such internationalized courses have been promoted through a **webinar** opened to all teachers of the alliance, yielding a starting group of almost a hundred teachers having expressed their interest for experimenting this initiative. Beside this, the teachers of the alliance get also involved in providing their online teaching through the UNITA Virtual Mobility (VM) initiative.

With this internationalization at home, a student has the opportunity to attend a course given by a university partner, in the same classroom as the local students on site. For the spring and the autumn editions of the second year, the catalog of virtual mobility was composed of around 100 subjects. Around the same number of students have participated in this initiative.

Also students are encouraged to work together through events based on **ideathon/hackathon** model. In the first edition of such event, groups of inter-disciplinary students of different study level, and coming from different institutions, have met through a challenge based contest on “Green mobility”.



Up to now, most of the UNITA activities are provided to the students as optional activities. Even associated with ECTS, these ones in general do not contribute to the degree. Fortunately, the diploma supplement, as an official document provided by the new Europass platform, can be used in all institutions of UNITA as a first formal institutional valorization of successful international experience.

A model of UNITA diploma supplement has been designed to provide specific information related to all academic experiences that are not described in the syllabus of regular study programs. The alliance also works on the promotion of the other tools and services proposed by the new Europass platform.

A YEAR OF ACTION

START-UPS

Two panels were performed, financial experts and/or investors to engaged in conversation and discussion in the area of food and health to interested student entrepreneurs and start-ups. INNOUNITA has created an interactive database with all start-ups/spin-offs supported and/or connected by the UNITA university environment; and has developed a digital environment dedicated to facilitating communication between all actors in the entrepreneurial field.

KNOWLEDGE AND INNOVATION COMMUNITIES (KIC)

Cross-KIC event and EIT KICs central open day to spread the opportunities offered by the EIT KICs to interested parties (students, emerging entrepreneurs, start-ups).

TRAINING PROGRAMS

INNOUNITA developed a common training programme within the consortium (November 2022), targeted to PhD students and young researchers within the consortium, with special emphasis on the Health and Food areas. The training programme would allow a standardised training within the consortium by incorporating the best practices of each university framework and addressing the existing gap.

INNOUNITA PITCH

The pitch competition is a good event particularly for young researchers and PhD students to showcase their business idea and develop it into business pitches. A winter school is planned to target the administrative staff of the consortium partners.

More specifically, Connect UNITA project aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Meet the needs for integration of learning management systems and learning spaces for students and teachers of UNITA alliance institutions and future associated partners, to **break down geographical, linguistic, and temporal barriers** and support collaborative digital learning spaces.
- Provide a **unified framework** to guide teachers through a digital and pedagogical transformation in the creation or adaptation of learning resources and activities to remove barriers that limit international **collaboration in teaching and learning**.
- Create an international teaching and learning **living lab for teachers and students of the UNITA alliance**, as well as for the international community, thanks to the co-design and co-production of courses, oriented both to the transfer and multiplication of competencies in technical and pedagogical innovation and in priority subjects of the UNITA alliance (such as cultural heritage, renewable energies, circular economy, among others).



A YEAR OF ACTION

Progression during the 1st year of the project- Design of a collaborative integration platform:

- The UNITA **cyber-physical connection machine** to travel in space, time and cultures.
- Design of a methodology to **support** teachers and students in the pedagogical and **digital transformation**.
