In order to promote the mobility of students, teachers and non-teachers, to enhance the social dimension of the campus and to support the community, services have been identified and welcome guides have been created.

The guides are designed in three formats:

- a web page, as a point of access in cyberspace;
- a document, organized as a printfriendly flyer, but primarily as an electronically shareable document, with structured text and images;
- a welcome video, aimed at a more agile and fast dissemination of information.





VIRTUAL CAMPUS

The UNITA Virtual Campus, #UVC, is a large-scale education, research and management information system, designed to provide federated services to a diverse and dynamic academic community.

Based exclusively on open-source technologies, #UVC encourages the development of new features to overcome potential limitations, sharing solutions and inviting new collaborators to solve existing or potential problems with the product.

Its functional prototype focuses on emphasizing its security, flexibility and scalability aspects, both in terms of applications and number of users.

From the 26th to the 27th of June 2023 at the University of Turin 140 academic and administrative staff of UNITA met to plan future matching events on education and research.




First results of the Matching event:

The impact of climate change on our environment

The importance of organizing UNITA competitions in each location of the alliance's partners has been essential to contributing to a more connected community and to a stronger connection between our physical campuses, especially in the aftermath of the pandemic.
