To answer this question, researchers in modern history at the USMB's <u>LSSETI laboratory</u> are developing a collaborative editorial project on French environmental history. This project aims to develop a historical narrative centered on the relationship between societies and environments, but using a chronology that does not coincide exactly with the major academic periods of history. How does it pay to be circular in production processes? Eco-innovativeness and green jobs as moderators of a cost-efficiency advantage in European small and medium enterprises *Business Strategy and the Environment*, Vol. 31, mars 2022, p. 1184-1203

Aurore Darmandieu and Antoine Renucci (Lirem), in collaboration with their colleagues Conchita Garces-Ayerbe and Pilar Rivera-Torres from the University of Zaragoza, show that engaging in circular production practices reduces production costs, by using data on 13,117 SMEs from the Flash Eurobarometer 2017. This effect is greater the higher the level of ecoinnovation, i.e. WHEN SMEs invest more in the implementation of circular practices.
